To the Supporters of BASSLIFE:

In 1993 we pledged that our goals, projects, efforts and the money we raised would be KEPT IN THE ARK-LA-TEX and spent primarily on preserving and developing our fisheries.

COMPLETED PROJECTS INCLUDE:

\$70,000 plus spent expanding Cross Lake Hatchery from 9 to 22 spawning ponds.

\$30,000 plus spent to provide over 425 Trophy Replicas to fishermen who have caught, certified and released bass alive over 8 lbs. at our 4 official weigh-in stations on Caddo and Cross Lakes.

Released over 3 million bass fingerlings in Caddo Lake, Cross Lake, the Duck Pond(Kings Hwy.), Bistineau, Black Lake (Benton), Cypress Lake, Wallace Lake, Red River and Grand Bayou.

Assumed all cost of raising bass at the Cross Lake Hatchery, annually (\$10,000)

Received 800 brood fish from Tyler, Texas Fish Hatchery

Recognized 13 Louisiana Game Wardens and furnished each with BPS units to assist with enforcement \$3500

\$11,750 to Caddo Commission for 50 ft. extension of dock at Earl G. Williamson Park on Caddo Lake

\$3000 plus to Texas Parks and Wildlife for Trophy Bass Tagging Program to study movement and growth patterns.

\$2,350 in clean-up projects on Cross Lake and Lake Bistineau

\$1750 to Caddo Commission for "Get Hooked on Fishing-Not Drugs" project on Caddo Lake

\$1500 donation to Caddo Sheriff's office for surgery on Axel, the drug sniffing dog.

\$1500 donation to P.O.I.N.T. annual special fishing project for the handicapped.

\$10,000 donation to refurbish all channel markers on Texas and Louisiana side of Caddo Lake in conjunction with Caddo Commission.

\$26,400 to Northwest Louisiana Wildlife & Aquatic Education for area school children

BASSLIFE Bass Limo, a 28ft. "catch and release" barge used to release Florida Bass Fingerlings in area lakes and rivers. Also used by Bass tournaments for release of bass.

\$500 donated to Northwest Autism Chapter-Camp Rainmaker at Lake Bistineau (done annually)

\$30,000 (over 3 year period) donated to Sciport Red River Project

\$10,000 to help replace damaged pier at Earl G. Williams Park on Caddo Lake

\$5,000 to date for equipment donated to Norwella Council Boy Scouts to earn fishing Merit Badges

\$10,000 donated to YMCA for restoration of Lake at Camp Forbing, including a handicap accessible ramp and walk

\$7500 donated to build a pavillion at Earl G. Williamson Park for the Oil City Environmental Science Magnet School, The pavillion is dedicated to the memory of Edward P.(Ed) Moseley, Jr.

600 hybrid bream put in pond at Shreveport Fish Hatchery for the children in the Aquatic Program for Catch and Release fishing
